POSITION OVERVIEW

The Division of Natural & Mathematical Sciences at LeMoyne-Owen College invites applications for an Assistant or Associate Professor of Chemistry for a nine-month, tenure-track faculty position, to begin in August 2023. Preferred candidates will have a background in Organic Chemistry and/or Physical Chemistry.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Effective teaching utilizing inclusive, data-driven pedagogies in the classroom
- Teaching undergraduate courses (lecture and labs) in Organic Chemistry, Physical Chemistry, and/or General Chemistry
- Provide research opportunities for undergraduate students in areas of Organic Chemistry, Physical Chemistry, or a related discipline
- Engage in professional development, collaborate with faculty, staff, and students to promote the college's mission and values, and serve on divisional and institutional committees

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- Graduation from an accredited institution with a doctorate in Organic Chemistry, Physical Chemistry, or related fields
- Evidence of experience teaching chemistry courses to undergraduate students
- Evidence of research experience in Organic Chemistry, Physical Chemistry, or related fields

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES

- Experience and/or training in inclusive teaching and mentoring practices
- Demonstrable knowledge and application of Organic Chemistry, Physical Chemistry, and/or General Chemistry in an undergraduate curriculum
- A record of incorporating evidence-based pedagogy, such as active-learning techniques, and innovative use of instructional technology in the classroom and/or online
- A record of curricular development, effective verbal and written communication, and the ability to work collaboratively with faculty, staff, and students
- The ability, desire, and skills to mentor undergraduate student research
- Demonstrate the ability to establish an active research program that centers around the mentoring of diverse undergraduates and leads to peer-reviewed publications

- Experience in teaching hybrid and/or online instruction
