LeMoyne-Owen College & City of Memphis Partner to Aid Small Business Owners

LeMoyne-Owen College and the City of Memphis Office of Business Diversity and Compliance have partnered to form the Memphis Small Business Development Partnership. The aim is to support to start-up business owners.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistic, 20 percent of small businesses fold in the first year so the goal is to prevent them from closing by proving education. To do this, a set of courses have been put together and are designed to teach owners how to effectively operate and sustain a successful business.

Currently, the City of Memphis, Office of Business Diversity and Compliance (OBDC) assist small business owners with technical and management assistance at no cost. The mentorship, advising, and training is targeted towards increasing employment, fostering growth, and improving stability.

The partnership with LOC will ensure the that new and potential business owners have the tools necessary for success. The rollout will lead to a certification for the owners. The goal is to create 500 new businesses, while 254 have already signed-on. With LOC's education structure, we can prepare women and minorities for success. Too, the certification program provides the tools for start-ups to compete for upcoming projects and with the vast amount of business heading for Memphis, locals will be ready.

The course design for the Memphis Small Business Development Partnership is comprised of five main courses and each course is five-weeks long. See course below. Attendees will earn a certification to become a qualified vendor and secure lucrative contracts with the city.


- 1. Starting a Small Business,



National Hispanic Heritage Month




October 2022—Midnight






