Public Information

The retention rate for the Accelerated Studies for Adults and Professionals (ASAP) was 76% in the Spring 2020 semester and 92% for our traditional programs. The traditional program was 92%. The retention rate for ASAP increased from 76% in the Spring 2020 semester, while the traditional program retention rate dropped from 92%. In the Spring semester of 2022, the retention rate for both programs rebounded, exceeding pre pandemic level. The ASAP programs retention rate rose to 82% and 90% for the traditional program as the restrictions on the COVID-19 pandemic eased.

MATA and LeMoyne-Owen partner to bridge technology gap for bus riders

LeMoyne-Owen College students will bridge the technology gap for Memphis bus riders via a new partnership with Memphis Area Transit Authority to establish the Go901 Tech Team.

The partnership was announced Tuesday, Sept. 27, at the William Hudson Transit Center, 444 N. Main St.

The tech team will consist of LeMoyne -Owen students enrolled in techrelated majors. They will help bus riders use smartphones and the Go901 app to better navigate the local public transit system.

The Go901 app allows MATA bus riders to use their phones to purchase and scan bus tickets electronically and also track their bus rides.


